2022-2023 Preschool applications are being processed and widely distributed! https://form.jotform.com/211446595790060

If you have not put the application on your social media or shared on Facebook (link or web address) please do so to encourage preschool participation! Preschool Matters campaign is going on since Late Aug. Includes billboards, radio, social media, and Daily Newsprint and social media campaign. As of 9/7/22 we have 328 enrolled. Some programs are full, while others have openings. About 50 openings across the MAISD.

32P Budget Status: We received our allocation for 2022-2023. In 2021-2022 had a \$300 cut. 2022-2023 32P cut was almost \$1000. We continue to communicate with our elevated officials that this grant does not cover required expenses and is one of very few State level Early Childhood programs that that received stagnant funding in the 2022-2023 budget process. Please see talking points to join us in the conversations! We have submitted the proposed budget and workplan. Once we have had our Feedback meting with our Great Start TA that information will be brought to the board for final approval.

2021-2022 Community Preschool Report: GSRP Current enrollment 330 children Annual Preschool report has been released. District specific information is in the report. Percentage of Children last spring that left GSRP at or above benchmark:

- 82% Early Mathematics
- 85% Early Literacy
- 91% Language Development
- 94% Physical Fine motor
- 95% Physical Gross motor

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MI Comp Fiscal Analysis Work Group: We continue to meet. Focus has ben on coming up with an actual cost for running high quality childcare and preschool opportunities. This may hep support the Universal Preschool case and help our elected offices have a better understanding of what they are paying for (or not paying for)!

All funding will be subject to approval by the State Superintendent. All ISDs that submit a plan will be notified of the State Superintendent's action and have the right to appeal.


