III. Public Comment:

IV. August Agenda Approval:

A motion was made by Renae Caudill and supported by Jennifer Peterman to approve the agenda of the August 2, 2023, meeting as presented, Motion was carried.

A motion was made by Renae Caudill and supported by Roger Thelen to approve the minutes of the June 7, 2023, meeting as presented, Motion was carried.

VI. Director Report: Cari O'Connor

2022-2023 Preschool applications are being processed and widely distributed! GSRP is currently Only enrolling income eligible at this point. Head Start is enrolling all eligible families. Legislation & Budget now supports three program options: School Day, Part Day, & Extended Day. Three Sub Recipients are considering' attempting to work out barriers to the 5 day a week/36 weeks programing requirements for Extended day.

Hired one Early Childhood Specialist; still have one position open! If anyone knows of someone with a master's degree, who is looking for contracted work around coaching teaching teams please send them my way!

Joint recruitment campaign in full swing: Social media, Geo Fencing, & marketing using technology, Billboards, & Daily News campaign all around Preschool Matters!

MAISD had submitted GSRP Allocation request for 2023-2024. We requested slots to serve 622 students (2022-2023 year we serviced over 500). We are planning to serve the same number of children (622 minimum) however with additional days and weeks (expansion choice). Greenville and TC Huntey's Clubhouse will be joining the pilot for 5 day a week 36-week programming option. **Need MCGSC board approval!

A motion was made by Roger Thelen and supported by Karen Marsman to endorse 622 slots full day – school day/extended day as presented; Motion was carried.

Vice Chair: We need one! Executive Team meets 4 x per year via Zoom.

First 10 Grant through the State of MI: Frist 10 Summer Summit will be on August 8^{th} in Lansing. We will be taking a team of 5 (3 parent representatives) and focusing on Central Montcalm School District due to the level of parent engagement specific to CM. If funding and time allows, Greenville is the second district to support. \$15,000 grant to support Math, Literacy, and Music activities for $PreK - 2^{nd}$ grade target population. Thank you in advance for any time you can contribute.

32P tentative allocation: We received a significant bump in 2023-2024 32P budget (\$80,000 more) AND an additional \$55,356 for 32 6 (Literacy funds DPIL & Talking is Teaching). **PREK for All Task Force:** First meeting occurred. Reviewing barriers to expanding the current PreK system and ways to build on strengths to expand access NOW! For example, 20 in classroom versus 16, teacher and associate teacher credentialing flexibility. Please take the **SURVEY!** https://miprek4all.org/

Continuing to work with Central Montcalm Public Schools to support childcare expansion opportunities. Central Montcalm Bond is coming August 8th! Encourage CM parents to get out and VOTE! Bond request will support several areas in CM schools, including childcare. Working with the Regional Childcare work team to help advocate for moving this forward! Regional Childcare Work Team: Data focused initiative. Meet regularly to work on childcare needs specific to Montcalm County System. Impact: working with Vibrant Futures to funnel monies from the regional grant to the MAISD to support childcare expansion applications. Current partnerships/leaders for Montcalm County work are MI United Way, Right Place, Greenville Chamber of Commerce, and Pathways. Funding for inspections and other licensing related barriers for childcare providers.

- Lakeview opened an Early Head Start building, 8 slots, ages 1-4 years of age. Receive the same services that home visit children receive. 45 days of enrollment children are accessed, and a health screening is completed. Creative curriculum is used, and additional ongoing assessment is used.
- Early Head Start application and Head Start application available on 8cap.org.
- 6 home visitors in Montcalm County, Maintain a case load of between 10-12 families. 48 home visits a year, for an hour and half.
- Head Start center in every district expect Vestaburg.
- Enrollment is currently 90% full.

We had parents of children who have been enrolled in Early On as well as staff. We will use this video for community outreach and to share with the potential Early On families.

We received funds from the Early Literacy hub to purchase books to give away to families through home visits for Early On families.

Grants/Funding:

Both 54D (State grant) and Federal Early On grant have been submitted for this school year. We are still using partial 54D funding to support GSC Parent Liaison to support playgroups.
