#### VI. Director Report: Cari O'Connor

**2023-2024 Preschool applications** are being processed and widely distributed! GSRP is currently Only enrolling income eligible at this point. Head Start is enrolling all eligible families. Legislation & Budget now supports three program options: School Day, Part Day, & Extended Day. Three Sub Recipients are considering' attempting to work out barriers to the 5 day a week/36 weeks programing requirements for Extended day.

**Still have one position open!** If anyone knows of someone with a master's degree, who is looking for contracted work around coaching teaching teams please send them my way! **MAISD will be resubmitting GSRP Allocation** request for 2023-2024 as Lakeview would like to open another classroom (1 teacher, 8 students) in the hope of increasing the capacity for 2024-2025 school year. We requested slots to serve 622 students (2022-2023 year we serviced over 500) so we will bump our request up to 630. Greenville and TC Huntey's Clubhouse are implementing the pilot for 5 day a week 36-week programming option.

First 10 Grant through the State of MI: First 10 Summer Summit completed, and team works We have a team working with Central Montcalm School District and the only district we are working with regarding this grant however as things progress, we will scale up projects results across the county. \$15,000 grant to support Math, Literacy, and Music activities for  $PreK - 2^{nd}$  grade target population. Thank you in advance for any time you can contribute.

**PREK for All Task Force:** Continue to meet with the Task Force to move forward. Looking at several states versions and how to avoid their mistakes. Also want to build on their successes. Reviewing barriers to expanding the current PreK system and ways to build on strengths to expand access NOW! Thank you to everyone that took the time to do the survey. Need to make sure our Rural communities are represented, and families have an opportunity to voice their needs/ October 2<sup>nd</sup> Dr Jill Griffen from MDE Office of Special Populations, visited the MAISD to also lift needs in rural communities.

**Regional Childcare Work Team: Data focused initiative.** Meet regularly to work on childcare needs specific to Montcalm County System. Impact: Still working on what that means for Montcalm County as we are working with Vibrant Futures to funnel monies from the regional grant to the MAISD to support childcare expansion applications. Still not happening. Current partnerships/leaders for Montcalm County work are MI United Way, Right Place, Greenville Chamber of Commerce, and Pathways. Funding for inspections and other licensing related barriers for childcare providers.

So, the Central Montcalm project is halted. Bathroom/plumbing work is all set but carpet and drywalling is not able to move forward. Central Montcalm capacity is there but we need money to flow again to finish the project.

#### As of November 27, 2023 Montcalm Area ISD Early On has:

- 26 Children in Referral
- 132 Children enrolled and receiving Early On Services.
- 36 of 132 (27.3%) students receiving Early On are ALSO receiving special education services (Michigan Mandated Special Education MMSE).

#### Michigan Department of Education (MDE) audit:

Montcalm Area ISD was one of 4 ISDs chosen to be audited by the state this fall. They looked specifically at Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) implementation. We had our closing meeting on November 20 and will receive the final written report soon.

#### **Professional Development Focus:**

We continue to work on the following 3 areas for Professional Development:

- Early Literacy Essentials Training
- Book study of "Raising a Healthy Happy Eater" by Melanie Potock and Nimali Fernando
- Making data based decisions

#### Outreach and Early On Video: Early On Video Link

Cindy presented to Leadership Montcalm about early childhood opportunities in Montcalm county. We have used our new video to share with local districts at all levels and also in social media campaigns.

#### **Early On Talking is Teaching:**

We have an Early On Talking Is Teaching poster that we have been using for promotions. We are including it in the initial parent packets and providers are discussing when a child qualifies for services.




