#### VII. Director Report: Cari O'Connor

**2022-2023 Preschool applications** are being processed as openings occur. We will be starting the enrollment process for 2024-2025 on or near March 1<sup>st</sup> 2024. The Joint recruitment application has gone live and is also available in hard copy! We appreciate your continued support toward getting as many of our little ones into preschool programming!

**First 10 Grant** through the State of MI has wrapped up however we will continue to have Montcalm Basics available to support families and have proved the top 10 books materials to all of our interested preschools, childcare providers in Central Montcalm as well as all of the local libraries in Montcalm County! Budget amendment to move money from The Basics line item to accommodate more library and Head Start Top 10 book project.

**PREK for All Task Force**: Final recommendations and for the PREK for ALL Roadmap document as well as the detailed brief were completed. Inclusion Collective Action plan initiatives, removing income eligibility barriers, bringing back funding for the facilities grant work to increase licensable space, and providing a more streamlined system to support teacher entry into the field are just some of the key elements of the Road Map! Ste of State announcement: not three years away, Governor would like to start process in 2024-2025. Priority enrollment process (our Joint Recruitment process) will ensure that most at risk have priority enrollment, but ALL have the opportunity regardless of income. **See PREK for All SLIDESHOW Data and Introduction** 

**MI LEAP**: Michelle Richards has been named director of MiLEAP. We are being told that nothing will change at this point as far as way of doing business. More to come for sure but our plan has been submitted along with the budget and we are awaiting approval.

#### A. MAISD Bond Proposal Information: Penny Dora

- What is Montcalm Area ISD asking for in the 2024 bond proposal?
  - O Montcalm Area ISD is asking voters to authorize \$36.8 million to fund improvements to four of the district's buildings, including:
  - o A significant addition and renovation to the Seiter Education Center. This building provides services for students with moderate or severe disabilities.
  - Renovations and improvements to the Montcalm Area Career Center infrastructure improvements that support career and technical education for 12 CTE programs offered for high school students attending Montcalm County schools.
  - Basic improvements in roofing, heating, and electrical systems at Montcalm Transition Center (MTC) and Hamler Administration Building
- Bond Amount This request is for \$36.8 million.
- Millage Increase This will be an increase of 0.65 mills for a 20-year term.
- Eligible Voters This bond proposal will be presented to all registered voters residing in the service area of Montcalm Area ISD. Our service area includes the school districts of Carson City-Crystal, Central Montcalm, Greenville, Lakeview, Montabella, Tri County, and Vestaburg. All seven of our school districts encompass parts of bordering counties in their school boundaries.

## As of March 25, 2024 Montcalm Area ISD Early On has:

- 21 Children in Referral
- 136 Children enrolled and receiving Early On Services.
- 30 of 136 (22%) students receiving Early On are ALSO receiving special education services (Michigan Mandated Special Education MMSE).

#### Outreach and Early On Video: Early On Video Link

We will be doing a push to reach out to agencies and physician offices when the new Early On logo and promotional materials come out in the fall of 2024.

#### **Professional Development:**

- We are finishing up our book study about Infant/Toddler feeding and MAISA's Early Literacy Essentials.
   In March we completed training on Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) educational eligibility determination using START training.
- Our focus on data to monitor progress continues with our first data dive scheduled for May.
- Our team completed Mandated Reporter Training with DHHS staff and have handed out lock boxes/bags to families who have requested them.

#### Playgroups:

We had consistent programming with good attendance in February and March! We have our end of the year celebration planned and are planning for our summer groups. The summer schedule will be out soon!

#### GooseChase:

We have partnered with the GSC family Liaison to support a literacy based Goose Chase for Early On families. We have had good interest so far.
