VI. Director Report: Cari O'Connor

2023-2024 Preschool applications are being processed and enrollment has started. The Joint recruitment application has gone live and is also available in hard copy! We appreciate your continued support toward getting as many of our little ones into preschool programming! We are looking at operating as many as 30 classrooms in 2024-2025. This would be an increase of 5 classrooms if we can get students enrolled! Thank you for your ongoing support.

First 10 Grant through the State of MI has wrapped up however we will continue to have Montcalm Basics available to support families and have a meeting with Central Montcalm Pre K and Kindergarten educators April 17th to support Kindergarten transition activities and communication between grade levels! We have submitted our final statement of expense.

PREK for All Task Force: Final recommendations and for the PREK for ALL Roadmap document as well as the detailed brief were completed. Inclusion Collective Action plan initiatives, removing income eligibility barriers, bringing back funding for the facilities grant work to increase licensable space, and providing a more streamlined system to support teacher entry into the field are just some of the key elements of the Road Map. Priority enrollment process (our Joint Recruitment process) will ensure that most at risk have priority enrollment, but ALL have the opportunity regardless of income. **MI LEAP:** Michelle Richards has been named as director of MiLEAP and Emily Laidlaw is Assistant Director. We are still working through changes in personnel and department processes. Midyear reports have continued to be processed in the same manner. More to come for sure but our plan has been submitted along with budget and we are awaiting approval.

MCGSC Parent Board members are needed. Please contact Cari directly if you have families that you work with that would be interested.

Kindergarten Round Up survey is in process. We look forward to having data to review! **MCGSC Strategic Plan** updates and review process will begin starting the June meeting. We are working in alignment with the Community Health Needs Assessment (COREWELL) and Montcalm Human Service Coalition processes that are community wide. More to come for us! MHSC survey: 1349 responses! This will be great data for us to support our process.

As of May 29, 2024 Montcalm Area ISD Early On has:

- 25 Children in Referral
- 142 Children enrolled and receiving Early On Services.
- 34 of 142 (24%) students receiving Early On are ALSO receiving special education services (Michigan Mandated Special Education MMSE).

Outreach and Early On Video: Early On Video Link

We will be doing a push to reach out to agencies and physician offices when the new Early On logo and promotional materials come out in the fall of 2024. We attended the Baby Shower and Family Fun day at the MACC in May. We plan to tag along with the GSC at the Montcalm County Fair in June.

Staff Appreciation:

We solicited appreciations from our families to let the Early On staff know how much they are appreciated. We received 33 responses from families with heartwarming stories of Early On's impact in children's lives.

Parent Surveys:

MAISD sent out a survey and received 15 responses. Results were very positive with parents reporting that they feel they receive quality home visits, have clear communication, and have a voice in their child's IFSP.



The MCGSC is committed to developing a seamless system that utilizes community resources and supports to help families gain access to tools needed to provide a healthy start for all children.





Overview of 2023 Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library

Highlights:

- 16,487 free Imagination Library books were mailed to Montcalm County preschool children in 2023.
 - Welcome Book- 755
 - Graduation Book- 349
 - o Regular- 15,383
 - Number of children served- 1,886
- Since our inception in 2013, the MC DPIL has mailed 127,337 books.
 - Welcome Book- 4,639
 - Graduation Book- 2.315
 - Regular- 120,383
 - Number of children served- 5,844
- According to research, children are now attending preschool better prepared to learn, because they were provided high quality, age-appropriate books during their first years. Parents stated that their child is more prepared to enter preschool, because of their Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library experience.

Challenges:

Long term, stable funding is a challenge. The price of the books is \$27.00 per child, per year, or \$2.25 per month. This low cost of \$2.25 per book includes postage and handling. DPIL in Montcalm County is a gift from the community and historically not supported by any one organization or any form of funding, state or federal entities. However, since we mail approximately 1,300 books per month, almost \$35,100 needs to be raised annually through grants, donations and fundraisers, to serve children presently registered. For the 2023-24 school year, state funds (32p6) were used to support DPIL in Montcalm County. This is thought to be a one-time funding option legislated by the State of Michigan. Each year, we face the challenge to obtain funding needed for this program to continue. We are continuing our partnership with Greenville Area Community Foundation to create a long-term sustainability plan to ensure this community gift could continue for future generations.




2023 Registration Data/Information


Children are being registered and graduating from the Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library on an ongoing manner. The number of registered children receiving books varies from month to month. Finding ways to reach and register children in the birth-to-age-four age group is a constant effort, conducted primarily by volunteer MCGSC board members, birth to five parents, community service providers, and MCGSC Family Coalition members.



With their partnership, we hope to build readers from birth! We also partner with Early On and Welcome Baby to support registrations.

During a recent survey with parents, they were asked about how they found out about Dolly Parton Imagination Library, most of them have heard about Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library through a friend or family member! Word of mouth and friends and family continue to be the top recruiter for DPIL participation.






Number of Children Enrolled by Location Data Pulled 12/29/2023

Explanatory Notes for 2023:

- ✤ 96% of all funds were used to purchase the 16,487 Imagination Library books that were mailed out in 2023. The local cost is \$2.25 per book, which covers the book, postage, and handling. This low cost is possible because of matching funds from the Governor's Books from Birth Foundation and by special arrangements with publishers made by the Dollywood Foundation.
- Undelivered Books/Postage: Books that are unable to be mailed to the address located on the book or forwarded to a current address are sent back to the post office and held until we can pick up the undelivered books. When picked up, the US Post

Office requires that we pay for the return postage. These returned books are provided to Montcalm County families throughout the year via, Playgroup, Welcome Baby and various MCGSC family coalition activities.

Marketing: In previous years we have purchased brochures, bookmarks, and stickers to promote at county community events, this past year we ran ads in our local newspaper (Daily News Paper), promoting Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library program and thanking our donors for their ongoing support for 10 year of DPIL service to our birth to 5 children.

Parent Survey 2023 Results:

183 Parents completed the annual Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library survey

Table 1 below shows that 51% of parents reported that Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library increased their children's interest in reading or looking at books by "a lot." 59% of parents reported an increase in the amount of time parents have spent with their child.





Table 1: Change in Literacy Activity

Table 2 shows that children receiving Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library books are supporting children to learn to read at an early age. According to parents, Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library participating children have greater general knowledge, have expanded their vocabulary, and become readers that are more fluent. Research tells us that early readers can recognize a larger number of words by sight, which enables them to learn more from and about their environment. Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library supports our children in this learning process!

Parents are their child's first and best teacher; therefore, providing tools to parents that encourages them to talk, read and sing with their child every day is critical. Even parents with poor literacy skills want to raise readers and Montcalm County Dolly Parton Imagination Library helps support them in their efforts to teach their child basics of how to hold a book correctly.
