# VI. Director Report: Cari O'Connor

**2024-2025** Preschool recruitment continues and applications are being processed and distributed as they come in! We have processed approximately 900+ applications and this number is lower than at this time last year. We appreciate any help you can provide! **MAISD submitted GSRP Allocation request for 2024-2025**. Operating a total of 26 classrooms this school year. Greenville and Tri County, & Huntey's Clubhouse are implementing the pilot for 5 day a week 36-week programming option. Huntey's site in Lakeview will not be opening this year.

**Michigan Educator Workforce Initiative:** CDA, Bachelors, and potentially Masters Degree support is available to staff who are working in/at any level of Early Childhood and or education. Please have anyone that you are connected with email me directly if they would like to be considered for this pilot.

**32P and 32p6 EOY reports** are completed and submitted to Mi Leap. We have enough carry over to ensure that we can continue to meet our obligations with our Welcome Baby! Funding. MCGSC uses \$28,000 to support the Welcome Baby! Program in Montcalm. Legislated restrictions create barriers so we have to plan for carry over in order to keep the program whole. At this time, due to budget restraints this is the only early childhood programming we are able to fund at this time.

**MAISA Video Update:** Spoke with Kyle. Video series is still in progress. Looking at release dates in Jan/Feb. Also working with PBIS as potentially this series will be broadcasted as it aligns with PBIS and their Early Childhood priorities.

MAISA Early Childhood Summitt: MAISA ECAN planned and implemented an Early Childhood Summit to lift up advocacy needs and built a shared understanding of ISDs

# Childcare Resources

Financial Assistance & Information for Families

# **Federal and State Programs**

Child care assistance programs are designed to make childcare more affordable for families, support children's early development, enable parents to work or pursue education, and promote economic stability and growth.

# Child Development and Care (CDC) Program

Michigan's CDC scholarships (subsidies) provide financial assistance to eligible, income constrained families by providing direct payments to childcare providers, reducing out-of-pocket costs.

# Free/Low-Cost Preschool Programs

These preschool programs provide early childhood education at little to no cost, ensuring children receive essential developmental and learning opportunities regardless of their family's financial situation.

Head Start and the Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) are federally and state funded PreK programs for eligible 3- & 4-year-olds.

# Assistance for Military Families

The federal government offers subsidies to members of the military and the Department of Defense.

Child Care Aware of America will provide more information on eligible programs and assistance.

# Childcare Tax Opportunities

Tax credits are available to help lower the cost of your childcare. The resources provided here are intended as informational only and are not a substitute for professional tax advice.

# Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit

With this tax credit, you are able to itemize up to \$3,000 in childcare expenses per child (\$6,000 maximum).

Families can't use this tax credit and their FSA for the same expenses. For example, if a family with more than one child has already set aside the maximum of \$5,000 in their FSA, they can only claim \$1,000 toward the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit.

# Earned Income Tax Credit

The EITC is a tax credit available to low- to moderate-income wage earners. The credit can range from a few hundred to several thousand, depending upon how many children you have and what your filling status is.
